## Funding programmes

### International

- <u>Alexia Foundation</u>Photographers and visual journalists from any country may apply for this grant.
- <u>Awesome Foundation</u> The Foundation distributes \$1,000 grants (or the local equivalent) to projects and their creators.
- <u>CNL Travel Bursary for foreign translators</u>This bursary is intended for foreign translators who wish to spend time in France to accomplish a translation project of a French work into their own language, intended for publication.
- <u>Dave Bown Projects</u>This competition is open to all visual artists who are 18 years of age or older. All styles and mediums are eligible. Prizes: \$10,000 USD (1 artist will receive \$5,000 USD and 5 artists will each receive \$1,000 USD) cash.
- <u>Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation</u>Grants available to emerging figurative artists
- <u>Hemera Foundation</u>The program is open to domestic and international applicants, qualified are artists —visual, performing artists, and writers— who are rigorously committed to their art form and who have a demonstrable interest in contemplative practice.
- <u>Mobility First! ASEF Cultural Mobility Initiative</u>Mobility First! supports the travel of Asian and European artists between Asia and Europe.
- <u>Pollock-Krasner Foundation</u>The Foundation's mission is to aid, internationally, those individuals who have worked as professional artists (in the fields: painting, sculpture, installation and works on paper) over a significant period of time.
- <u>Prince Claus Fund</u>By covering travel costs, the Mobility Fund assists in the professional growth of those it supports. The Mobility Fund is open throughout the year to receive applications.
- <u>Santo Foundation</u>The foundation provides assistance directly to artists in the form of individual monetary awards, travel stipends... All mediums of visual art are eligible and all artists are welcome to apply regardless of country, state or residency status.
- <u>Sustainable Arts Foundation</u>The program focuses on awards to individual artists and writers with families. Specifically, the applicant must have at least one child under the age of 18.
- <u>Virginia A. Groot Foundation</u>The Foundation offers three grants to artists who have exceptional talent and demonstrated ability in ceramic sculpture or sculpture.
- <u>W.Eugene Smith Memorial Fund</u>Grant to documentary photographers
- <u>Working Artist Org.</u> Awards available to photographers and all artists worldwide, working in all traditional and new visual arts mediums, including but not limited to: conceptual, installation, drawing, painting, prints, sculpture, glass, mixed media, new media, photography and video.

- <u>Copyright Agency</u>The Copyright Agency's Create Career Fund supports individual mid-to-late career artists and authors by providing grants to support time to write and create. Applicants must be Australian citizens or permanent residents.
- <u>Ian Potter Cultural Trust</u>The Ian Potter Cultural Trust's main program offers grants to assist early career artists of exceptional talent to undertake professional development, usually overseas - from visual arts to performing arts and music to literature.
- <u>National Association for the Visual Arts</u>NAVA offers a range of grants, awards and scholarships to support and develop the work of visual arts, craft and design practitioners.

## Finland

## Great Britain

- <u>Artists Fund</u>Grants are made to visual artists who have been practicing professionally for a minimum of 3 years and are over 18 years of age, either as graduates or as self-taught artists. Artists with any visual arts practice are eligible to apply.
- <u>Artists' International Development Fund</u>The programme supports individuals based in England to travel, explore and collaborate internationally while

carrying out professional projects. The fund is open to musicians, visual artists, writers. There are several rounds of funding to apply for each year.

- <u>Arts Council England</u>Grants for the Arts is a funding programme for artists, musicians, writers, performers.
- <u>Society of Authors</u>The Society of Authors administers a number of grants for writers.
- <u>Wales Arts International</u>The International Opportunities Fund supports professional arts practitioners based in Wales to undertake international visits.

### Iceland

• <u>Icelandic Art Center - Mobility Grants</u>The Icelandic Art Center assists Icelandic or Iceland based visual artists in working or presenting their art abroad with mobility grants. Mobility grants are for travel, accommodation and/or maintenance abroad.

- <u>National Association of Latino Arts and Cultures</u>The NALAC Fund for the Arts is a national grant program open to US-based Latino working artists, that demonstrate artistic excellence in pursuit of social justice through the arts.
- <u>National Endowment for the Arts Creative writing fellowships</u>The NEA Literature Fellowships program offers grants in prose and poetry to published

creative writers that enable the recipients to set aside time for writing, research, travel, and general career advancement. Applicants must be citizens or permanent residents of the United States.

- <u>Native Arts and Cultures Foundation</u>The Native Arts and Cultures Foundation (NACF) offers support to individual Native artists, communities and organizations nationwide.
- <u>Pen America</u>The PEN Literary Awards are given to writers in the fields of fiction, science writing, essays, sports writing, biography, children's literature, translation, drama, or poetry.
- <u>Poetry Society of America</u>The PSA's Annual Awards offer emerging and established poets recognition at all stages of their careers.
- <u>Puffin Foundation</u>Grants to artists, based in USA, working in the disciplines music, photography, theater and visual arts, who are often excluded from mainstream opportunities due to their race, gender, or social philosophy.

- <u>Artist's Resource Trust</u>Artist's Resource Trust (A.R.T.) provides support to the creative work of mid-career (aged 35 and older) visual artists living in New England, or Columbia or Northeast Dutchess Counties, NY. Grants awarded generally range from \$1,000 to \$10,000.
- <u>ArtsKC Fund Inspiration Grants</u>The grant provides direct support to individual artists and arts professionals of the Kansas City metropolitan area, for projects and activities that have the potential to advance their careers.
- <u>Bronx Council on the Arts</u>Bronx Recognizes Its Own (BRIO) provides direct support to individual Bronx artists who create literary, media, visual, and performing works of art.
- <u>Chicago Artists Coalition / MAKER Grant</u> The MAKER Grant Program is an annual, unrestricted award opportunity for Chicago-based contemporary visual artists.
